Keeneland Association, Inc.



Keeneland Association Inc. is renowned throughout the world for the quality of its Thoroughbred racing and sales.

Located in Lexington, Kentucky, Keeneland conducts race meetings in April and October. The spring meeting features the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G1) for three-year-olds and the Ashland Stakes (G1) for three-year-old fillies. In the fall, many races are steppingstones to the Breeders' Cup World Championships, including the Juddmonte Spinster Stakes (G1), Shadwell Turf Mile (G1), Dixiana Breeders' Futurity (G1), Darley Alcibiades (G1), and Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup (G1).

Keeneland conducts four Thoroughbred auctions annually: a horses of all ages sale in January; a two-year-olds in training sale in April; a yearling sale in September; and a breeding stock sale in November. In 2009, Keeneland sold more than 7,300 horses for \$396 million.

Keeneland also owns the Thoroughbred Training Center near Lexington. Formerly the Kentucky Horse Center, the facility has two training tracks and stabling for 1,188 horses.

Profits from racing, sales, and simulcasting at Keeneland are returned in the form of higher purses for horsemen, promotion of the Thoroughbred industry, capital improvements, and contributions to charitable, educational, and research organizations.

Robert N. Elliston

President and Chief Executive Officer

Robert N. Elliston has been president and CEO of Turfway Park since June 1999, shortly after the track was purchased by Keeneland Association, Harrah's Entertainment, and GTECH Corporation.

Before coming to Turfway Park, Elliston was vice president of commercial lending for US Bank, N.A., for seven years. He continues a relationship with that institution, serving on its Northern Kentucky Advisory Board of Directors. Additionally, Elliston worked for the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce in Frankfort from 1986 to 1992, serving as vice president of economic and community development and representing the Chamber before the Kentucky General Assembly and the United States Congress.

An avid horse racing enthusiast his entire adult life, Elliston currently serves as executive chair of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association Board of Directors and is treasurer of the Kentucky Equine Education Project (KEEP) Board. He also serves on the Thoroughbred Racing Association Board and the University of Louisville Equine Program Advisory Board. In 2002, Elliston was named Man of the Year by the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, and in 2003 he received the Kentucky Harness Horsemen's Presidential Award for distinguished service to the horse industry.

Long active in the Northern Kentucky community as well, Elliston has chaired the Northern Kentucky Chamber of Commerce as well as the board of Sanitation District No. 1. He also is a member of the Executive Committee of the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce, the Northern Kentucky University Foundation Board, Gateway Community College Foundation Board, and the Tri-County Economic Development Board of Directors.

Elliston, his wife, Sharon, a Northern Kentucky attorney, and their two daughters, Abby and Haley, live in Florence, Kentucky.

2009 Fall Meet

Turfway marked its 50th anniversary during the meet, kicking things off with a lunchtime party on Fountain Square, the heart of Cincinnati, and ending with 50-Plus, honoring area companies also in business 50 years or more. A poster signing to benefit the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund brought together 23 of the track's former leading jockeys.



On September 28 Turfway earned full accreditation by the National Thoroughbred Racing Association Safety and Integrity Alliance.

Under competitive pressure from surrounding states with casino gaming, Turfway shelved the Marfa Stakes, the Weekend Delight Stakes, and both juvenile races of the Kentucky Cup Day of Champions.

On the plus side, the Turfway Park Fall Championship (G3) was again a Breeders' Cup Challenge "Win and You're In" race. The winner, Todd Pletcher's Nite Light, was eighth in the Breeders' Cup Marathon.

Kentucky Cup Day of Champions

Despite losing the juvenile races, the Kentucky Cup series again proved its value to the Breeders' Cup World Championships when Furthest Land won the Kentucky Cup Classic (G2) and then the G1 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.



Also on Kentucky Cup Day, Kentucky First Lady Jane Beshear returned for the second annual Horses and Hope celebration, a breast cancer awareness initiative targeting the state's horse industry workers. Six graduates of the North American Racing Academy competed in an exhibition race, with 2008 graduate Matthew Straight reprising his win in the first exhibition last year. Ten area students divided \$10,000, courtesy of Turfway's fifth College Scholarship Day.

Stats

On-track handle fell 16.1 percent; all-sources handled dipped 6.3 percent. Field size averaged 8.5. No racing days were canceled.

Leaders and Notables

Trainer Joe Woodard earned his first Turfway title with a 30 percent win rate. His principle owner, Billy Hays, posted 18 wins from 59 starters, likely a meet record in the leading owner category. Leandro Gonçalves earned his first career leading rider title. On October 1, eventer-turned-jockey Amanda Tamburello rode 18-1 Include de Uno to notch her first career win.

2009 Holiday Meet

A long shot in the last race gave Brian Feldman of Mason, Ohio, the \$8,250 first prize in Turfway's qualifier for NTRA/DRF National Handicapping Championship XI. Because he had already qualified for the national contest, however, Turfway's fourth-place finisher, Brian Troop, earned the qualifier spot instead. A month later, Troop, of Barrie, Ontario, won NHC XI and the \$500,000 first prize.

Stats

Thanks to strong play out of state, all-sources handle ticked up 0.6 percent despite a 17.7 percent drop in on-track handle. Average field size held steady at 10.1, compared to 10.4 during the same period of the previous year. High winds forced the cancellation of one card.

Leaders and Notables

Apprentice jockey Ben Creed became the first graduate of the North American Racing Academy to win a riding title at any track. Joe Woodard won his second straight training title. Woodard's principle

client, Billy Hays, earned his third straight title as leading owner. On December 12, apprentice jockey S. Justin Bishop rode his first career winner, 39-1 Elliday.

2010 Winter/Spring Meet

A perfect economic storm—recession, declining horse population, and horses racing elsewhere for gaming-enhanced purses—led Turfway to cut its traditional five-day live schedule to three days a week in January and February and four days a week in March.

Lane's End Stakes

Dean's Kitten won the 39th Lane's End Stakes (G2) and next ran 14th in the Kentucky Derby (G1). Lane's End runner-up Northern Giant tried the Preakness (G1), finishing 12th. The seventh Maker's Mark



Lane's End Stakes commemorative bottle marked two firsts: 8,000 were produced and the label featured an entire team, the 1990 World Champion Cincinnati Reds. The eighth Charity Night at the Tables drew more than 800 to benefit six local charities, with the Gateway Community and Technical College Foundation taking the \$10,000 first prize.

Stats

The reduction in racing days brought significant decreases in handle as expected—24.3 percent on track and 19.1 percent all sources—but daily averages rose 4.2 percent on track and 11.5 all sources. Daily purses increased 2.3 percent. Field size averaged 8.6 compared to 7.9 the previous winter. Three cards were canceled, two weather-related and one, a make-up day, for lack of entries.

Leaders and Notables

Rex Stokes III won his first Turfway riding title, helped by mounts for the meet's leading trainer, Joe Woodard, who earned his third straight title. Billy, Donna, and Justin Hays were the leading owner; under his name alone, Billy Hays had won the three previous titles. Monica Krummen earned her first win as a trainer on January 15. A day later Gaffney Station gave trainer/co-owner Branden Bingham and co-owner Scott Fairfield their first wins with their very first starter. Jockey Thomas Pompell earned his 2,000th career win the same day.

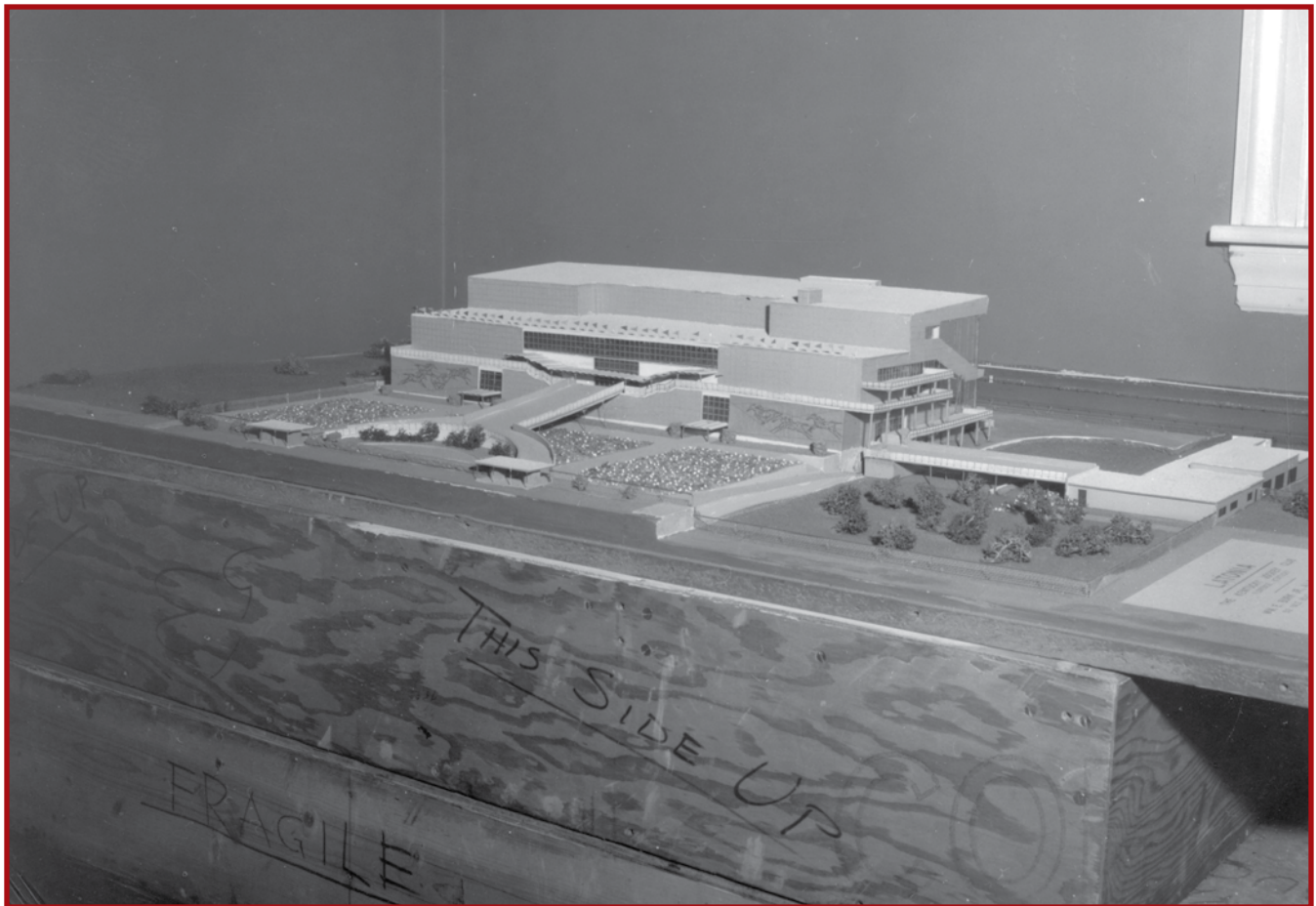

Turfway was just a dream and an architect's model when ground was broken in November 1956. The track opened as Latonia in 1959, making 2009 its 50th anniversary year.



Annual Attendance and Handle

Options for playing the races increase as technology advances. In September 1988, Kentucky began intertrack wagering, allowing patrons to bet on races at any Kentucky track from any other Kentucky wagering location. Beginning in July 1994, full-card simulcasting allowed patrons at any location to bet on races from tracks across the country. Advance deposit wagering has increased players' options even more. Today, nearly 90 percent of money wagered on races in North America is bet at off-track sites, by phone, or online.

1988 champion 3-year-old filly and Kentucky Derby winner Winning Colors, one of just three fillies to win the Run for the Roses, earns her final career stakes, the Turfway Budweiser Breeders' Cup on October 2, 1989.



August 27, 1959

Latonia Race Track opens in Florence, Kentucky, running a 34-day meet. Highest one-day attendance is 11,415; top one-day handle is \$427,647. The name recalls the original Latonia, which operated from 1883 to 1939 about 10 miles north of Florence.

September 9, 1968

On the first day of the Fall Meet, Latonia presents the first Thoroughbred race in Kentucky to be run at night.

September 24, 1969

Judes Song wins at 241-1 and pays \$484.40, highest win payoff in the track's days as Latonia.

April 1, 1972

Big Dot wins the first Spiral Stakes, established by General Manager John Battaglia for horses "spiraling up" to the Kentucky Derby.

March 22, 1974

Deleterious, Quipid, and Bob Twinkletoes score a rare triple dead heat in Latonia's eighth race.

March 31, 1979

Latonia records its first \$1 million day when bettors wager \$1,021,493 on a card that includes the Spiral Stakes.

December 7, 1980

Latonia becomes the first Kentucky track to offer Sunday racing.

March 27, 1982

Jim Beam begins its 17-year sponsorship of the Spiral Stakes.

September 18, 1982

Latonia becomes the first Kentucky track to offer simulcast wagering when the 1982 Marlboro Cup is beamed in from Belmont Park.



April 1, 1984

The Jim Beam Stakes is run as a Grade III race for the first time, with At the Threshold the winner.

April 9, 1986

Jerry Carroll and partners purchase Latonia for \$13.5 million and rename it Turfway Park. Price Pike, which fronts the facility, is renamed Turfway Road.

September 14, 1986

Trained by Jack Van Berg, Alysheba breaks his maiden in Turfway's third race. Famously dismissed as "the pony from Latonie" by training legend Woody Stephens, Alysheba later wins the 1987 Kentucky Derby and Preakness, finishes second by a nose in the 1987 Breeders' Cup Classic, is 1988 Horse of the Year, and retires as the then-richest Thoroughbred in history.

March 27, 1987

J. T.'s Pet wins the first Jim Beam Stakes to carry a \$500,000 purse.

September 9, 1987

Pick 3 wagering makes its Kentucky debut at Turfway Park.

February 28, 1988

Riding Mean Action in the eighth race, Patricia Cooksey earns her 1,203rd career victory and becomes the winningest female jockey in history.

April 2, 1988

The Jim Beam Stakes gains Grade II status.

September 8, 1988

Turfway inaugurates intertrack wagering in Kentucky by sending its entire card to Ellis Park. Two months later the track sends its signal to Louisville Downs.

October 2, 1989

Winning Colors, who in 1988 became only the third filly to win the Kentucky Derby, wins her final career stakes in the Turfway Budweiser Breeders' Cup.

May 19, 1990

Summer Squall wins the Preakness Stakes, becoming the first Jim Beam Stakes winner to take a Triple Crown race.

January 1992

Hansel becomes the first Jim Beam Stakes winner to earn an Eclipse Award, taking top 3-year-old honors for his wins in the 1991 Jim Beam, Preakness, and Belmont stakes.

May 2, 1992

Lil E. Tee becomes the first Jim Beam Stakes winner to win the Kentucky Derby.

March 27, 1993

Prairie Bayou wins the first Jim Beam Stakes to carry a \$600,000 purse. He later wins the Preakness and becomes the race's second Eclipse Award champion.

July 22, 1994

Full-card simulcasting begins in Kentucky.

September 24, 1994

Turfway presents the first running of the Kentucky Cup Day of Champions. The Classic's first winner is Preakness and Belmont winner Tabasco Cat.

December 28, 1994

Turfway opens The RaceBook at Turfway Park, a state-of-the-art simulcast facility.

March 31, 1995

Serena's Song becomes the only filly to win the Jim Beam Stakes. She is later the race's third Eclipse Award winner and retires as racing's then-richest female.

September 23, 1995

On Kentucky Cup Day, trainer D. Wayne Lukas wins a record four stakes on one card, including the Classic with 1995 Kentucky Derby and Belmont winner and eventual 3-year-old champion Thunder Gulch.

September 21, 1996

The Kentucky Cup Classic achieves Grade III status.

October 26, 1996

Boston Harbor becomes the first Kentucky Cup winner to win a Breeders' Cup race. Winning the Juvenile race at both events, he later wins the Eclipse Award as champion 2-year-old.

March 23, 1998

Fifty winning tickets cash in on the largest Pick 6 in Turfway history: \$1,474,380.

March 29, 1998

Turfway's signature race is run for the last time under the Jim Beam aegis and one day late, postponed by damaging high winds.

September 26, 1998

Silver Charm and Wild Rush dead-heat for win in the Kentucky Cup Classic. Reraise wins the Kentucky Cup Sprint and will later win the Breeders' Cup Sprint and an Eclipse Award.

January 15, 1999

Keeneland Association, Harrah's Entertainment, and Dreamport Inc., a division of GTECH, announce an agreement to purchase Turfway Park for \$37 million. The sale is completed in March.

March 27, 1999

Turfway's signature race is sponsored for the first and only year by Gallery Furniture and is run as the GalleryFurniture.com Stakes. Stephen Got Even gets the winner's share of the record \$750,000 purse.

September 25, 1999

The Kentucky Cup Classic is run for the first time as a Grade II race. Third in that race, Cat Thief will later win the Breeders' Cup Classic.

July 12, 2000

Turfway introduces FasTrack Rewards, a player loyalty program patterned after similar programs offered by Harrah's casinos.

September 16, 2000

A record Kentucky Cup Day crowd of 11,090 watches Spain win the Turfway Breeders' Cup on her way to winning the Breeders' Cup Distaff.

November 28, 2001

Turfway sets a new precedent for rewards by sending 90 FasTrack Rewards members on an all-expense-paid trip to Harrah's Casino in Laughlin, Nevada.

March 23, 2002

Carrying a \$500,000 purse, Turfway's premier race gains sponsor Lane's End Farm and is run as the Lane's End Spiral Stakes. Winner Perfect Drift is later third in the Kentucky Derby.



September 14, 2002

Vindication wins the Kentucky Cup Juvenile on his way to winning the Breeders' Cup Juvenile and the Eclipse Award as champion 2-year-old.

September 4, 2003

Turfway becomes the first track in the nation to install the Super Carrel, a state-of-the-art individual handicapping and wagering station.

September 13, 2003

Cajun Beat wins the Kentucky Cup Sprint, a prelude to winning the Breeders' Cup Sprint.

February 9, 2004

Jockey Mike Rowland dies of head injuries sustained in a three-horse spill at Turfway on February 4, the first fatality at a Kentucky track since 1975 and the first ever at Turfway.

March 12, 2004

Jockey Rafael Bejarano wins seven races on one card, a Turfway record.

March 20, 2004

TURFWAY PARK MILESTONES (continued)

Sinister G wins the Lane's End Stakes at 16-1 and headlines a track record \$106,848.20 Superfecta payoff.

April 7, 2005

Turfway runs its last race as a dirt track, a one-mile claiming event won by Lucky Creek, with Rafael Mojica Jr. aboard for trainer Murrell Farmer.

July 30, 2005

GTECH sells its one-third share in Turfway to the track's two remaining partners, Keeneland Association and Harrah's Entertainment.

September 7, 2005

Turfway Park becomes the first track in North America to race on Polytrack. The night's first winner is Regal Reproach, a 6-year-old gelding trained by Eric Reed and ridden by Inosencio Diego for owners Jerry Brumley and Kay Reed. Regal Reproach runs the mile in 1:40.72.

September 17, 2005

Turfway hosts its first College Scholarship Day, giving away ten \$1,000 scholarships on Kentucky Cup Day.

March 25, 2006

Off at nearly 49-1, With a City becomes the Lane's End Stake's highest-priced winner, paying \$99.60, and the first to win on Polytrack. The Bourbonette Breeders' Cup attains Grade III status; Lemons Forever runs third and goes on to win the Kentucky Oaks.

April 6, 2006

Apprentice jockey Julien Leparoux ends the Winter/Spring Meet with a record 167 wins, topping by 17 the mark set by Rafael Bejarano in 2004.

August 30, 2006

Turfway introduces Turfway Concessionaire, a subsidiary responsible for the track's food and beverage service and in-house catering.

October 5, 2006

Nine days after losing apprentice status, Julien Leparoux wins the Fall Meet riding title with 38 wins, breaking the record set in 1968.

March 24, 2007

A record crowd of 23,815 turns out to see Hard Spun win the Lane's End Stakes.

July 19, 2007

Turfway launches Park Avenue Catering, an off-site catering service.

August 2007

FasTrack Rewards adds Elite, Platinum, and Gold categories to reward players based on level of play.

June 18, 2008

The Turfway Park Fall Championship (G3) is named a Breeders' Cup Challenge "Win and You're In" race for the Breeders' Cup Marathon, new to the Breeders' Cup World Championships in 2008.

September 3, 2008

Turfway adds the \$1 Super Hi 5 to its wagering menu.

September 27, 2008

Fatal Bullet wins the Kentucky Cup Sprint, next is second in the Breeders' Cup Sprint, and in December earns Sovereign awards as Canada's champion sprinter and Horse of the Year. Bear Now wins the Kentucky Cup Distaff (formerly the Turfway Breeders' Cup) and at year's end is named Canada's champion older mare.

December 27, 2008

The \$1 Super Hi 5 wager returns a record \$17,137.70 payoff.

December 28, 2008

As Turfway Park, the track records its highest win payoff, \$279.80.

September 27, 2009

Furthest Land wins the Kentucky Cup Classic and steps up in November by winning the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile to give owners Ken and Sarah Ramsey and trainer Mike Maker their first Breeders' Cup win. Turfway earns full accreditation from the National Thoroughbred Racing Association Safety and Integrity Alliance.



September 2009

Turfway celebrates its 50th anniversary with special on-track and community events. In a fan survey ranking the top 10 horses ever to race at the track, Alysheba tops the list.

December 6, 2009

Brian Troop of Barrie, Ontario, qualifies at Turfway for the NTRA/DRF National Handicapping Championship and in January wins the national tournament.

December 31, 2009

Apprentice jockey Ben Creed is the Holiday Meet's leading jockey, becoming the first graduate of the North American Racing Academy to win a riding title at any track.

TURFWAY PARK RECORDS



After early unsuccessful attempts at sprints, Bluegrass Warrior was sold to three friends, Linda Printz, Dottie Kehl, and Marjorie McGlinn. Convinced by a jockey that the horse wanted to run long, the women entered him at distances instead.

He was difficult to exercise but took to Joanie Cook, McGlinn's daughter, who exercised him and then took over his training in 1987, late in his 2-year-old year. When he retired in 1998, the owners gave him to Cook, who cared for him daily and was at his side when he died suddenly in 2008 at age 23.

NOTE: In 125 career starts Bluegrass Warrior compiled a 21-15-10 record and earned \$231,533. His average winning distance was more than 1 5/8 miles. He holds Turfway's dirt-track records for 1 5/8 miles, 1 3/4 miles, and 2 miles.

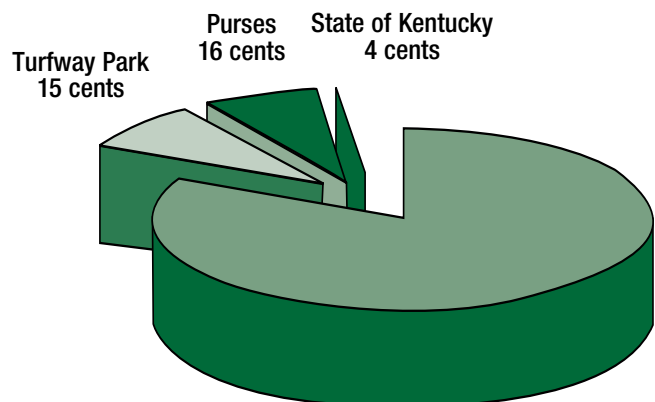
