

LANE'S END STAKES MILESTONES

With Jim Beam sponsorship boosting the purse, Latonia's Kentucky Derby prep race began to attract top quality horses from across the country. In 1983, the charge was led by Marfa, a famously bad-tempered horse trained by D. Wayne Lukas. After winning the Beam, Marfa went into the Derby the morning line favorite and the 2-1 betting co-favorite. Though he finished fifth in the Derby, Marfa put the Jim Beam Stakes (later the Lane's End Stakes) on the national radar for the first time.



April 1, 1972

Latonia General Manager John Battaglia launches the Spiral Stakes for 3-year-olds "spiraling up" to the Kentucky Derby. Big Dot completes the one-mile course in 1:38 4/5 for the winner's share of the \$10,000 purse. The crowd numbers 7,730.

May 1, 1976

Inca Roca is the first Spiral Stakes winner to start in the Kentucky Derby, finishing seventh of nine.

1977-1980

Trainer William E. "Smiley" Adams (here with Major Run, 1980) wins the Spiral Stakes four years in a row, including both divisions in 1977, 1978, and 1980, for members of the Lehmann family and the family's Golden Chance Farm.

September 12, 1981

Spruce Needles, winner of the Spiral Stakes' second division in 1980, becomes the race's first Grade I winner with his victory in the Arlington Handicap.

March 27, 1982

Bourbon maker Jim Beam assumes sponsorship of the race, called the Jim Beam Spiral Stakes. Good n' Dusty wins for trainer Jasper Adams, a son of William E. "Smiley" Adams. The purse jumps from \$50,000 to \$150,000 and the distance increases to 1 1/16 miles.

March 26, 1983

Marfa wins the Jim Beam Spiral Stakes and later becomes the first winner from the Beam era to compete in the Kentucky Derby, finishing fifth.

April 1, 1984

The race achieves Grade III status and is renamed the Jim Beam Stakes. The purse increases to \$300,000. Pat Day scores the first of five Jim Beam wins with a one-length score aboard At the Threshold for trainer Lynn Whiting and owner W. Cal Partee.



March 29, 1987

The Jim Beam Stakes is run under the Turfway Park banner for the first time following the 1986 sale of the track to Jerry Carroll and partners. The purse rises to \$500,000, equaling the highest for any Kentucky Derby prep. J. T.'s Pet gives jockey Pat Day, trainer Lynn Whiting, and owner W. Cal Partee their second Jim Beam win.

May 4, 1984

Lucky Lucky Lucky, fourth in the 1984 Jim Beam, becomes the race's first competitor to win the Kentucky Oaks.

March 22, 1986

Broad Brush wins the Jim Beam by two lengths and later finishes third in both the Kentucky Derby and the Preakness.

April 2, 1988

The Jim Beam Stakes gains Grade II status and the distance is increased to 1 1/8 miles. The winner, Kingpost, later finishes second in the Belmont Stakes.

April 1, 1989

Aboard Western Playboy, Pat Day wins his third Jim Beam. Two weeks later Western Playboy becomes the first Beam winner to "spiral up" to win the Blue Grass Stakes.

March 31, 1990

Riding Summer Squall, Pat Day takes his fourth Jim Beam Stakes. The two later win the Blue Grass Stakes but settle for second behind Unbridled in the Kentucky Derby.

May 19, 1990

Summer Squall evens the score with a two-length victory over Unbridled in the Preakness Stakes, becoming the Jim Beam's first classic winner.

March 30, 1991

Hansel wins the Jim Beam Stakes in a track record 1:46 3/5.

May 18, 1991

After inexplicably finishing 10th in the Kentucky Derby, Hansel wins the Preakness.

June 8, 1991

Hansel holds off Strike the Gold to win the Belmont Stakes by a head and at year's end is named champion 3-year-old, the first Beam winner to earn an Eclipse Award.

March 28, 1992

Lil E. Tee gives owner W. Cal Partee and trainer Lynn Whiting a perfect three-for-three record in the Jim Beam and brings jockey Pat Day's total to five Beam wins.

May 2, 1992

Lil E. Tee becomes the first Jim Beam winner to win the Kentucky Derby.

March 27, 1993

The Jim Beam purse jumps to \$600,000, richest among Derby preps. Prairie Bayou wins under Hall of Fame jockey Chris McCarron. The pair will finish second in the Derby. May 15, 1993

Prairie Bayou wins the Preakness, becoming the Beam's fourth consecutive classic winner. Fatally injured in the Belmont Stakes, he is voted the year's top 3-year-old.

April 2, 1994

Leading start to finish, Polar Expedition wins the Jim Beam Stakes. He will retire in 2000 as the second leading Illinois-bred earner.

April 1, 1995

Serena's Song becomes the only filly to win the Jim Beam Stakes. She subsequently finishes 16th in the Derby after leading the first mile, gets four Grade I wins for the year including the Haskell against males, sets a distaff earnings record of \$3,283,388, and earns the 1995 Eclipse Award as champion 3-year-old filly.

March 30, 1996

Roar gives owners Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider and trainer Claude R. "Shug" McGaughey III their first Beam wins.



March 29, 1997

Concerto becomes the first John A. Battaglia Memorial Stakes winner to score in the Jim Beam Stakes. Attendance for the Beam hits a record 20,737.

March 29, 1998

After damaging winds force a one-day delay, Event of the Year wins the Jim Beam by five lengths. Injury forces the colt off the Kentucky Derby trail. Jim Beam sponsorship ends after 17 years.

March 27, 1999

Stephen Got Even wins the first and only GalleryFurniture.com Stakes by 2 1/2-lengths. The purse, \$750,000, and the attendance, 21,028, are both records.

March 25, 2000

Absent a sponsor, the race again becomes the Turfway Spiral Stakes. Attendance of 22,480 sets a new record. Globalize, son of Jim Beam winner Summer Squall, wins.

March 24, 2001

Balto Star wins the Turfway Spiral Stakes by 12 3/4 lengths, a record for the 1 1/8 mile distance.

March 23, 2002

Lane's End Farm assumes sponsorship of the race, called the \$500,000 Lane's End Spiral Stakes. Perfect Drift wins by a neck and next finishes third in the Kentucky Derby.

March 22, 2003

The race becomes the Lane's End Stakes, named solely for its sponsor, with New York Hero the winner. Premium bourbon distiller Maker's Mark signs on to sponsor the VIP Tent.

March 20, 2004

Sinister G leads a track record \$106,848.20 superfecta with his 16-1 win. In honor of the race, Maker's Mark issues its first limited edition bottle to commemorate a Northern Kentucky event. All 1,200 bottles sell out in two hours.

June 5, 2004

Fifth in the Lane's End and eighth in the Kentucky Derby, Birdstone wins the Belmont by a single length, ending Smarty Jones' Triple Crown bid.

March 26, 2005

A record 22,747 fans turn out to see Flower Alley post a half-length win in the Lane's End. Ninth in the Derby, he later wins the Jim Dandy (G2) and Travers (G1).

March 25, 2006

With a City, son of Lane's End stallion City Zip, wins the first Lane's End Stakes on Poly-track. He pays a race-record \$99.60 for the win.

March 24, 2007

Hard Spun wins the Lane's End and later is one of just two horses to try all three Triple Crown races, finishing second in the Derby, third in the Preakness, and fourth in the Belmont. The first Lane's End poster, produced by competition among design students at Gateway Community and Technical College, is released.

March 22, 2008

A record 2,031 guests fill the new Maker's Mark VIP Tent, the largest tented facility ever erected in Northern Kentucky.

March 21, 2009

Hold Me Back gives trainer Bill Mott and jockey Kent Desormeaux their first Lane's End wins and next is second in the Blue Grass.

March 27, 2010

Ken and Sarah Ramsey earn their first Lane's End victory with Dean's Kitten, a homebred son of their turf champion Kitten's Joy. The win is also the first in the race for jockey Cornelio Velasquez.

Lane's End Stakes 2010:

Dean's Kitten 'a ton of horse' coming home

Racing four-wide, Dean's Kitten waited behind a moderate pace set by Ranger Heartley, moved with about four furlongs to go, and kept the advantage from the 3/8ths pole to win the Lane's End by 2 1/2 lengths. "I had a ton of horse at the top of the stretch," said winning jockey Cornelio Velasquez. "I was very confident in him."

Northern Giant made a big move of his own in the stretch to finish second. Connemara, the 8-5 favorite, was another 3 1/4 lengths back in third. After Ranger Heartley's half in :48.57 and three-quarters in 1:12.68, Dean's Kitten stopped the clock at 1:50.59 for the 1 1/8-mile race.

"I really like this horse," said Velasquez. "He's why I came here today. He has a lot of try. He loves Polytrack. He can run on grass, but this is his track. Mr. Maker (trainer Mike Maker) never gave me any instructions. I just wanted to keep him off the pace."

"We were looking for just what we got," said Maker. "I thought he was laying perfect."

The bettors' third choice at 6-1, Dean's Kitten paid \$15, \$6.20, and \$3.40.

Fourth and following in the Lane's End were Chief Counsel, Vow to Wager, Letsgetitonmon, Outlaw Man, Doubles Partner, and Ranger Heartley.

Dean's Kitten is a homebred son of Ken and Sarah Ramsey's prolific turf champion Kitten's Joy. The Lane's End pushed Dean's Kitten's record to 3-1-2 in 11 starts and earnings of \$418,495.

The win was the second in the Lane's End for Maker, who saddled the victorious With a City in 2006, and the first for the Ramseys and Velasquez.

On the Triple Crown trail

With Robby Albarado aboard for the Kentucky Derby, Dean's Kitten broke from post eight, was caught in tight at the start, and never reached contention, finishing 14th. Northern Giant contested the Preakness, finishing 12th under Terry Thompson.

Rushaway Stakes (Listed): Exhi

Under Russell Baze, Exhi gained control of the Rushaway before the half mile mark and held a stubborn length advantage over runner-up Lonesome Street from inside the 3/8ths pole to the wire. In the Paint closed for third, another 4 3/4 lengths back. Following were Positive Split, Instant Message, Max Silverhammer, Activity Report, and Pathoki. Final time for the 1 1/16 miles was 1:44.47. Exhi is trained by Todd Pletcher and owned by his breeder, Wertheimer and Frere.



Bourbonette Oaks (G3): Orchestrator

Orchestrator stalked Helen Belen's early pace, took over at the head of the stretch, and held off fellow stalker Age of Humor to win the Bourbonette by a neck. Midway Holiday came from off the pace to finish 2 1/4 lengths back in third, followed by Cactus Cadillac, Absinthe Minded, Helen Belen, Allegation, Lisa's Kitten, and Cascading. Final time for the mile was 1:38.29. Orchestrator is trained by Ken McPeek, owned by Koolmen Racing Stable, and was ridden by Alex Solis.



Hansel Stakes: Cool Bullet

With Calvin Borel aboard, Cool Bullet fought with Kera's Kitten through an opening quarter in :21.61, set the half in :44.45 ahead of Strapping Groom, and then cruised to win the six-furlong Hansel Stakes by 4 1/2 lengths in 1:08.97, barely off the track record. Strapping Groom was second, followed 9 lengths back by Rockin' Rockstar. Behind were Lucky Chuck, Kera's Kitten, Plutonium, and Justamatterof time. Cool Bullet is trained by Steve Margolis and owned by Winmore LLC and Robert and Lawana Low.



Queen Stakes: Silver Time

Leading after half, 20-1 Silver Time dug deep to come again in the final strides, defying the late run of Proud Heiress to take the Queen Stakes by the barest nose. Secret Gypsy was 5 3/4 lengths back in third, followed by She's Extreme, Sweet Gladys, Indian Footsteps, Life Lesson, Vegas Wedding, Rinterval, and Prairie Prize. Silver Time is trained by Jeff Barkley, owned by Cottonwood Stables, and was ridden by John McKee. Final time for the six furlongs was 1:10.15.



Fairway Fun Stakes: My Baby Baby

Under Alex Solis, My Baby Baby sat off the pace, moved with a quarter left, led into the stretch, and denied Danzon's big run to take the Fairway Fun Stakes by a neck. Irish Ridge raced in second, led briefly on the turn, and stayed to finish 3 1/4 lengths back in third, besting Grande Annee, Indigo North, Selene's Delight, and Blissful Song. Final time was 1:44.72 for 1 1/16 miles. My Baby Baby is trained by Ken McPeek and owned by Magdalena Racing, et. al.

2009: Hold Me Back comes flying



Hold Me Back made his 3-year-old debut memorable, closing from next to last to take the Lane's End by 1 3/4 lengths, the first win in the race for jockey Kent Desormeaux, trainer Bill Mott, and owner WinStar Farm. After a slow start—"I thought I was hopelessly beaten," said Desormeaux—Hold Me Back closed with a rush.

2008: Adriano calms down and steps up



Newly calm in the paddock and stalking perfectly under Edgar Prado, Adriano gave trainer Graham Motion a Lane's End win on his first try. In the Derby Adriano was slammed hard in the first turn, faltered, and finished 19th. Back on turf that summer, he won the Kent Stakes (G3).

2007: Hard Spun earns 'Crown credence



Usually a frontrunner, Hard Spun rated to win the Lane's End and emerged a top Derby contender. Second in the Derby, third in the Preakness, and fourth in the Belmont, he was one of just two horses (Curlin was the other) to contest all three Triple Crown races.

1998: Event of the Year blows them away



One day after high winds forced a delay in the Jim Beam Stakes, Jerry Hollendorfer trainee Event of the Year romped by five lengths, the last winner under Jim Beam's 17-year sponsorship. Undeclared and highly regarded, the colt was later knocked off the Derby trail by injury.

1994: Polar Expedition wins for the home team



James Cody's homebred gelding Polar Expedition turned an ordinary pedigree into an extraordinary career. Racing mostly in Chicago, he won 20 of 48 starts and \$1.49 million, second-highest for any Illinois-bred. The 1994 Jim Beam was his sixth of 14 stakes wins and one of five graded stakes.

1993: Prairie Bayou is 3-year-old champ



Taking the lead off a powerful move on the final turn, Prairie Bayou won the Beam by a 3/4-length margin. He "spiraled up" to win the Blue Grass Stakes, fell 2 1/2 lengths short as the Derby runner-up, and won the Preakness. Fatally injured in the Belmont, he was 1993's champion 3-year-old.

Lil E. Tee's win made owner Cal Partee, trainer Lynn Whiting, and jockey Pat Day a perfect three-for-three in the Jim Beam, including a 1984 score with Lil E. Tee's sire, At The Threshold. Spurning odds of nearly 17-1, Lil E. Tee became the first Jim Beam winner to win the Kentucky Derby.

1991: Hansel takes Beam, two Classics, & Eclipse



Health problems at two did not deter Hansel at three. After winning the Jim Beam Stakes in track-record time, he redeemed a 10th-place finish as the Derby favorite with a seven-length win in the Preakness, a head score in the Belmont, and the Eclipse Award as the year's top 3-year-old.

1990: Summer Squall is first Classic winner

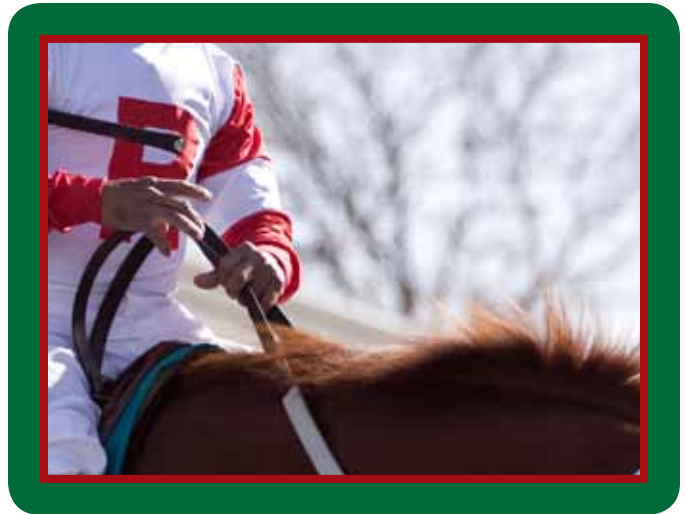
enjoys a sterling reputation for its stallions and sales divisions and for matings, boarding, breaking, training, racing, and bloodstock representation.
